At the time they were living in Indonesia, but due to Laura's high risk pregnancy and some health concerns for their one-year-old daughter Mika, they decided to come back to the States for the baby's birth. Luke Evan Porterfield was born on July 21st and has been such a joy to all of us. He is a happy little boy whose contagious smiles light up the room. Mika is a wonderful big sister, and it has been an amazing gift to us as grandparents to spend many hours with her. We are filled with wonder as we experience the world through

her eyes. A few months after getting back to the U.S., Jason and Laura decided through much prayer and consultation with others not to return to their ministry in the slums of Jakarta after Luke's birth. Jason has accepted a position as the U.S. Director for their mission organization, Servants to Asia's Urban Poor, and is also working on a Master of Divinity degree through Fuller Seminary.
