Ready to Start a Church

It takes a great deal of planning, work and resources to start a church and the Oklahoma City Friends Church has been working at it for several years now. After almost a decade of prayer and consideration, the OKC Church decided that it was time to take the step of faith to begin the Hispanic church that will share their facility located in a predominantly Hispanic community. In the summer of 2011 Filiberto Dominguez did an internship with the church to make initial contacts. Since then, the church and the Dominguez family along with the Central Oklahoma Churches have anxiously awaited the start-up date that is now targeted for the end of this year. The wait right now is to:

- 1. Identify 20 more people who will commit themselves as prayer supporters.
- 2. Obtain INS approval for a religious worker's visa for Filiberto and his family.
- 3. Find 13 more churches or individuals to pledge \$100 per month for support and ministry expenses.



So much work has already been done under the leadership of OKC Pastor Nick Shaffer and the "Partner Team" that has been formed for this new work. We thank God for the lives that will be touched.
